### Objectifs:

The aim of this course is to develop students' comprehension and expression in English, in particular by promoting oral fluency and the enrichment of their English vocabulary.

It is primarily intended as an alternative for students who do not opt for the language stay abroad for 5 ECTS credits in module PP1. Those who do take the option of the language stay abroad are nonetheless welcome to participate, if numbers allow, though such students cannot gain further ECTS credits from the course.

### Contenu:

"Talking Point" is intended to give students a further opportunity to practise their comprehension and expression in spoken English. One well-prepared presentation per student is required (on a topic of the student's choice) of around 20 minutes' duration, including discussion. Each presentation should be designed to involve the other students in discussion (or even argument!).

### Forme de l'évaluation:

Continuous assessment of presentations and participation in the class.

### Documentation:

Depending on student numbers, activities may also include discussion of texts taken from high-quality contemporary writing on a range of themes related to English-speaking culture, as well as other speaking activities to promote fluency.

### Pré-requis:

Before beginning this course, students need to have reached a level in English of at least B2 (Common European Framework), roughly the equivalent of the Cambridge First Certificate Examination.
