Objectifs:

At the end of the course, students will be able to

- identify different varieties of English on the basis of their pronunciation and linguistic features
- discuss the history of how English has spread around the world
- use on-line resources for the investigation and comparison of varieties of English
- describe how varieties of English can be grouped into different classes, and discuss what makes classification sometimes difficult

Contenu:

English is a global language that is spoken all over the world. Besides British, American, Canadian, and Australian English, there are many more varieties: Indian English, Singapore English, Hong Kong English, Nigerian English, and many others. This course will be a rough guide to the global spread of English, and to the commonalities and differences of global varieties of English. We will listen to different English voices (in songs, speeches, and interviews) and analyze texts from different varieties. We will talk about accents and dialects spoken in England, as well as about international varieties such as Irish, Australian, and Indian English. For each variety we will discuss its socio-historical background and its characteristic linguistic properties, especially its grammatical peculiarities and its pronunciation. We will also discuss the role of standard varieties as opposed to regional varieties. A substantial part of the course will deal with the question how varieties of English can be compared against one another.
