Objectifs:

The aims of this course are the following:

- To develop students' close reading skills, learned in the first-year Introduction to Literature course.
- To pursue in more depth a specific genre, period, or theme in modern literary history
- To improve expository and critical writing skills, notably through class participation and through reader-response papers
- To improve research-paper writing skills, notably by preparing on oral presentation based on a critical article, and by learning how to integrate secondary criticism into a longer essay

Contenu:

This course will examine what historian Tony Judt has called « The Forgotten Twentieth Century ». In other words, what is the place of the recent turbulent history of the twentieth century in our own « age of forgetting »? How have past events, including Western imperialism and decolonization, war, genocide, and totalitarianism shaped the world we live in? What is the role of literature, of ideas, and of intellectuals in remembering and learning from these events? Particular attention will be paid to defining what makes us human, and to the role of democracy in protecting our humanity.

Forme de l'évaluation:

Ev. interne: one in-class oral presentation (10%), two essays (6-8 double-spaced pages each) (90%).
