## Période d'enseignement:

Semestre Printemps

#### Equipe enseignante:

#### **Objectifs:**

To introduce students to the study of languages in contact

#### Contenu:

What happens when two or more languages are spoken in the same place? In this class, we will take a closer look at languages in contact. There are many consequences of language contact: borrowing, transfer, bilingualism, language death, creolization, and the formation of linguistic areas are among the topics that we will consider. A special focus will be on scenarios of language contact that involve English as one of the contact languages.

### Forme de l'évaluation:

Four different tasks are being evaluated in this lecture course.

First, there are obligatory weekly reading assignments. Each week, students will read a text and complete an online quiz (10% of the final grade).

Second, we will form groups of 3-4 students. Each group will be responsible for presenting a research article (20% of the final grade).

Third, oral participation in class discussions is a requirement (10% of the final grade).

Finally, a written exam at the end of the semester accounts for the remaining 60% of the final grade.

Rattrapage: Failure to reach 60% of all possible credit points will incur a rattrapage of an essay of about 15 pages (6,000 words) on an assigned topic.

#### **Documentation:**

Readings will be distributed via Claroline.

#### Pré-requis:

Students must have taken an introductory linguistics class. English language skills are necessary.

#### Forme de l'enseignement:

This seminar will require active student participation during discussions and student presentations.
