Objectifs:

The aims of this course are the following:

- To pursue in more depth the study of a literary genre
- To develop students' close reading skills
 To learn how to combine those skills with literary theory or philosophy in order to appreciate and to analyze a text
- To improve research-paper writing skills, notably by peparing on oral presentation based on a theoretical article, and by learning how to integrate secondary criticism into a longer essay
- To generate ideas in view of preparing a mémoire project

Contenu:

Borrowing my title from Elizabeth Bishop's collection of poems inspired by her life in Brasil, this course will examine the rich relation between travel and literature, beginning with Renaissance exploration narratives and ending with migrant testimonies. We will pay particular attention to the development of travel writing as a genre, with its often highly conventionalized rhetorical features, then look at how poets and novelists have adapted this genre to their own imaginary needs. Thematic questions we will address include travel and imperialism, travel and tourism, the semiotics of tourism, the tourist gaze, travel and gender, travel and class, and travel and diaspora. With the help of a journal, we will also think about the poetics of travel, or how travel, transculturation, and even sheer movement can influence the way we think and write.

Forme de l'évaluation:

Ev. Interne: oral presention of a critical or philosophical article (10%); travel journal (30%); critical essay (10-12 pages, 60%)
