Contenu

"English for teachers" is a class with a practical, applied linguistic perspective, geared towards the interests of future teachers. In this class we will focus on practical language as well as teaching practice and some reflection on classroom language teaching.

Among others we will deal with the following questions:

- What types of language are teachers using to help learners negotiate meaning and understand their environment?
- How are teachers making learning experiences meaningful and comprehensible in the classroom?

Apart from increasing students' fluency and hand-on practice of teacher talk, the course also offers the ideal possibility to get up to date with the language-specific methods and approaches. We will discuss and try out different ways of working with lexis; applicability of an inductive and deductive approach to grammar; as well as four basic language skills: reading, writing, speaking and listening. In this course you will also have an opportunity to try several technologies and tools (from webquests, quizlet to to blended learning) and see how to make the most of them.

Forme de l'évaluation

- Regular reading and participation in classroom activities and discussions (10%)
- Learning and teaching portfolio (40%) composed of
- *weekly tasks to be uploaded on regular basis
- *the final reflection to be submitted by June 18, 2019
- Written exam (50%)
