Contenu:

This course helps students to enhance their skills in close reading and text analysis; these skills are useful for writing papers.

Medieval writers were intrigued by the connection of stone with humans. Lapidaries examine the effect gems have on human dispositions. Romances feature gems as love tokens and as a source of magical power for their owners. Arthurian histories explore the construction of Stonehenge as a memorial to legendary kings. Religious texts depict the connection of stone with the human flesh as when God shapes Adam from earth and subsequently creates Eve from a rib extracted from Adam's body. Hagiographies speak of the power of a saint's bones (composed of "stony" minerals) to move about and to move others. In this seminar, we will discuss this intricate intimacy of stone and the human in medieval texts that has not lost its relevance in our day and age.
