Contenu

Non-literal meaning has long been a topic of central interest for linguists and pragmaticists, revolving around questions such as 'what is literalness', 'how do we get to understand non-literal language', 'what are the cognitive underpinnings of non-literality'. Theories on offer differ significantly from one another but to some extent tend to converge on a variety of interesting facts in the domain of communication, language, thought, and cognitive processing.

The main type of non-literal language on which we will focus in this class is metaphor, but a variety of other figurative types will addressed, such as irony, hyperbole etc.
