Contenu

As a first step, an introduction will clarify the key concepts to discuss the limits democracies are confronted with by technocracy and populism. These themes will then be extended and linked to migration through an historical and political approach. The last part of the term will be dedicated to a reflection on the role of intellectuals in democracies and an exploration of the relationship between media and democracy, starting from classical media to recent social media.

Forme de l'évaluation

Students will have to analyze a source and read a reference text for each session. The group responsible for the session will have to deepen the problematic starting with from a short bibliographic orientation. It will be in charge of a presentation of the source that will be followed by a reflection, discussion and synthesis.

Students wishing to earn credits for this seminar will be required to deliver a 15-page essay at the end of the semester.

The final grade will be weighted as follows:

Presence and participation (10%)
 Group presentation (30%)
 Trial (60%)

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Note: Failure to submit written work in a timely manner, without good reason, will automatically result in a flop of the exercise (échec).

This course is open to all students in history and social sciences (MA courses) interested in the relationship between democracy and migration.
