Contenu

This course is focused on the interfaces between deep subjectivity of individual human beings and the societal social suggestion systems for development of variable depths of reflections in the human mind: superficial expression of opinions ("social talk"), intermediate internal dialogues of complex moral and social issues, and, finally, deep unverbalizable feeling-into-society that is based on internalized values. The societal guidance of the personal subjectivities is seen to operate differentially for the three domains of subjective functioning (social pressures towards the internal depth), while the personal subjectivity operates in outwards direction from the core (moral values) through dialogues towards the ritualistic externalizations of socially accepted and expected dramatizations. The course entails take-home task (diary of personal feelings about social events) and in-class practical tasks of changing the subjective value of the immediate environment.
