Objectifs d'apprentissage

Au terme de la formation l'étudiant-e doit être capable de :

- Analyse a complex fact pattern, assess the relevance and importance of the facts and deduct the legal issues on one or more contemporary topics in EU law, as well as identify the relevant provisions of EU law, the topical case law of the CJEU and the legal doctrine that are applicable to solve the case, and recognise the uncertainties in the law
- Distinguish main issues from side-issues
- Recognise the key points in leading cases of the Court of Justice of the EU
- Relate different legal arguments to support the position of either the applicant or the defendant in a legal dispute, and assess the strength and weaknesses of these arguments
- Structure and construct coherent written submissions, in a legally sound manner, which make the best possible case in favour of one party to the dispute
- Prepare oral pleadings and plead a case in two languages (FR/EN) in a simulated procedure before the Court of Justice of the EU, presenting convincing legal arguments to the best advantage of one party to the dispute and responding critically to arguments from the other party, as well as standing up to the judge's questioning
- Organise and carry out in-depth research on contemporary complex topics in EU law and apply the acquired knowledge, both independently and in a team
- Discuss and defend arguments in a team, cooperate with fellow students in order to reach a common position and final product
- Apply professional standards, including assurances for quality control and work under time constraints typical in a legal practitioner's environment
- Integrate insights in judicial procedure
