Contenu

This course aims to introduce students to scholarly editing and to important early and critical editions of Shakespeare's plays and poems. In particular, we will focus on Shakespeare's Hamlet, a play that survives in very different versions: the texts of 1604-05, 1603 and 1623. We will explore theories of editing, the 'rationale of copy text', types of editions and the politics involved when it comes to editing canonical works of literature. Students will get hands-on-experience in class and at home as they will each be expected to produce their own critical edition of a section of Shakespeare's Hamlet.
