Contenu

Practical Language aims to improve students' command of grammar and usage as well as their ability to interpret spoken and written discourse and to engage with a variety of culturally relevant topics. The course allows learners to think about the functioning of the language and to examine language in use in a variety of authentic texts and digital materials drawn freely from across varied English-speaking cultures and beyond. Students can enhance their language awareness through grammar practice, analysis of different types of texts (literary, journalistic or other), and discussion of the broader issues which they raise. The course is designed to be immediately relevant to students' use of the language and to offer useful practice for those who wish to become language teachers.

Forme de l'évaluation

Continuous assessment: two 2-hour written tests (50% each) near the end of each semester (dates and times to be announced). Rattrapage by one 2-hour written test (100%) at the time of the following FLSH exam session (only possible if the two regular in-course tests have already been attempted).

Students should be aware that a key component of the course is the completion of regular assignments throughout the year, without which they will not be fully able to participate in the class.

Documentation

Course materials are distributed in class and posted on the Practical Language Moodle site for download.

Pré-requis

Before beginning this course, students need to have reached a level in English of at least B2 (Common European Framework), the equivalent of the Cambridge First Certificate Examination.

Forme de l'enseignement

Workshop: grammar practice and discussion of language points and questions of usage; analysis of authentic texts and digital materials; discussion of various culturally relevant topics.
