#### Contenu

This course will introduce students to canonical works of Restoration and eighteenth-century English literature as we explore ways in which women were represented in a range of literary genres produced by male and female writers. You will study a play by the first professional female dramatist, Aphra Behn; an example of amatory fiction, written by Eliza Haywood; poems by Jonathan Swift, the Earl of Rochester and Behn; and fictional and philosophical writings by Margaret Cavendish. Relevant secondary criticism will also be introduced to help students tackle topics such as patriarchy, female agency, misogyny, gender and class prejudices, sexual violence, authorship and prostitution.

NB. Some of the texts we will study contain representations of sexual violence
