Contenu

The course is divided in two parts. In the first part, we discuss the foundations of the law of external relations of the EU, and in the second, specific policies (e.g., common commercial policy, human rights, etc.). There will be a visit to the European Court of Justice in Luxembourg.

Forme de l'évaluation

The mode of examination is described in detail in the relevant Law Faculty statutes. Students are required to take two multiple-choice exams, one in the mid-semester, and one at the end of the semester. Students who have not taken the mid-term exam (which takes place in April, 2022), will not be allowed to take the final exam (May 2022). Class participation will be taken into account when grading students.
