Objectifs:

Practical Language classes are designed to help students consolidate and improve their proficiency in understanding and using spoken and written English. The course also aims to broaden students' knowledge of the cultures of English-speaking countries.

Contenu:

In addition to language practice, the course introduces a descriptive framework for the English language, including cognitive and functional approaches. This will enable students to develop their own mastery of the language independently throughout their studies and will also be useful for those who go on to teach. Language work is approached through analysis and discussion of authentic texts and audiovisual materials on varied aspects of the cultures of English-speaking countries.

Forme de l'évaluation:

Continuous assessment: two 2-hour written tests (50% each) near the end of each semester (dates and times to be announced). Rattrapage by one 2-hour written test (100%) at the time of the following FLSH exam session (only possible if the two regular in-course tests have already been attempted).
