**Objectifs:**

This course further develops students' skills in close reading and teaches them how to analyse literary texts in a critical way; trained in individual presentations and classroom discussions, these skills will be helpful to students for writing research papers.

**Contenu:**

Magic, marvels and miracles are omnipresent in medieval literature. Marvelous creatures populate accounts of (fictitious) travellers to the East. In hagiography, saints miraculously survive a series of gruesome torture. Chroniclers speak of military leaders who resort to magic in an attempt to beat their opponents. In romances, magic promotes or prevents meetings of clandestine lovers. In this seminar we will examine possible functions of the marvelous, of magic and miracles in a variety of medieval English texts (in translation).
