Objectifs:

This course aims 1) to develop theoretical links between socio-cultural and psychological perspectives on human mobility and 2) to equip students with training in collecting and analyzing empirical data.

Contenu:

As humans move, they encounter different socio-cultural worlds. In times of increased geographical mobility, more micro-level studies are needed to better understand people's experiences and the psychological phenomena involved in migration and mobility. This course invites students to read and reflect on the diverse and specific topics relating to human mobility from a socio-cultural perspective in psychology, and to engage in fieldwork research through collecting and analyzing empirical data.

Forme de l'évaluation:

- 1) Reading and class participation: Students are expected to complete all the assigned readings and to be prepared to discuss them. During the course, students will be engaged in group exercises and class discussions about fieldwork.
- 2) Final work: Students are expected to write an essay (5 pages) or to make a class presentation in English at the end of the course. Deadlines for submission:

30 June 2018

31 July 2018 (second trial)

In case of failure for those students who make an oral presentation in class, the second trial will be based on the written evaluation (paper).

Documentation:

Texts will be available for the students at the beginning of the term.

Pré-requis:

Knowledge of English.
