### Objectifs:

The course aims to introduce students in the law and practice of the European Union as an international actor.

#### Contenu:

The course is divided in two parts. In the first part, we discuss the foundations of the law of external relations of the EU, and in the second, specific policies (e.g., common commercial policy, human rights, etc.). The course visits the European Court of Justice in Luxembourg on April 9-10, 2018. This is a required aspect of the course.

The students who take both this course and the « Module européen – La Concurrence en pratique (UE et Suisse) » have the possibility to participate in the « Semaine européenne » on April 9-12, 2018 (see description above in the course catalogue). During this European week, visits will take place at the EU Court of Justice in Luxembourg (April 9-10) and at the EU institutions in Brussels (April 11-12).

STUDENTS MUST DECIDE WHETHER TO PARTICIPATE OR NOT IN THIS COURSE AT THE LATEST BY MARCH 5, 2018. TO THIS EFFECT, THEY HAVE TO ENROL IN THE CLASS BEFORE THE CLOSING OF BUSINESS OF MARCH 5, 2018. NO STUDENT WILL BE ADMITTED AFTER THAT.
