Contenu

Despite their decline towards the end of the 15th century, the Middle Ages have never ceased to capture the popular imagination. While the term medieval tends to be used negatively, for example to designate something as outmoded or to refer to practices of extreme violence, the medieval spirit is conjured up in numerous films, role playing games, comics, blogs etc. Usually, these modern adaptations are better known than their original sources. In this course we will examine a selection of medieval texts and artefacts that will enable students to better understand contemporary medievalisms such as references to Barack Obama as an Arthur figure or the Norman Conquest in the Brexit debate. At the same time, we will see how medieval writers too adapted earlier texts to serve their own (political) agenda.
