Contenu

Students - especially students of literature - consult hundreds of books during the course of their studies, and yet few of them have received instruction on the history of the book, how books were made, how they circulated, or on how to read material texts to gain insight into the initial reception of the authors and texts that we study. This course will provide a comprehensive overview of each of these topics.

The seminar aims to provide students (1) with a new approach to literary texts and European literary history, (2) the technical vocabulary needed to describe material texts and their production, (3) a set of conceptual tools for understanding and analyzing material books, (4) the skills needed to develop "bibliographic" projects independently, and (5) transferable skills (bibliography, metadata management, scientific description) to increase their employment opportunities.

Students will become familiar with the processes involved in the production of books, from paper production to the production of type, and from composition and printing to book binding. They will create their own books by making paper, by typesetting, and by using a hand press during a visit to the Swiss Museum of Paper, Writing and Printing (Basel).

Students will also learn how to produce formal descriptions of books (*) by consulting incunabula and other rare books in the collection of the Historical Library of the Venerable Class of Pastors at the BPU of Neuchâtel.

The course is aimed at all students of literature. It may be of particular interest to those who enjoy hands-on learning and to students considering careers or further study in museums, libraries, curation, and the book trade.

Forme de l'évaluation
