Contenu

In this seminar on contemporary fiction, we will approach five very different works published since 2000 as if they were state-of-the-nation novels, focusing in particular on the connected themes of identity, family, and society. Borrowing its title from George Packer's influential non-fiction narration of 'thirty years of American decline', the seminar will ask whether or not 'decline' should be considered as the period's defining trope.

Reading primary and secondary texts alongside the novels, we will first review some of the myths of American exceptionalism as well as myths of American decline. We will then read and discuss commentaries from both the Left and the Right on various symptoms of decline (e.g. inequalities of income and wealth, polarized parties, strained infrastructures, high incarceration rates, opioid epidemics, political extremism, ecocide, generalized spying, torture) and on their supposed causes (e.g. neoliberalism and globalization, end of empire, racism, identity politics, culture wars, immigration, new technologies and media, society of spectacle, foreign wars). Is America, as Julia Kristeva has argued, a society that is depressed because it cannot get passed its lost ideals?

OBJECTIFS D'APPRENTISSAGE

The aims of this course are the following:

- To familiarize students with literary and cultural history
- To pursue the study of a specific genre and period in more depth
- To improve research and writing skills
- To introduce students to some theoretical concepts
- To help students find a mémoire research topic
