The first part provides the basic analytical tools, including a taxonomy of the types of global public goods, a review of elementary game theory and a discussion of the basic financing principles of public services in an international context. The second part is devoted to the application of these analytical instruments to specific domains, such as global health, international security and global environmental problems.
