Contenu

In this seminar we will explore */King Lear/*, a play often described as Shakespeare's finest tragedy, alongside a recent adaptation set in contemporary India. Shakespeare's */Lear/* and Preti Taneja's */We That Are Young/* will enable us to consider adaptation and appropriation studies, the representation of gender and race, modern Indian and early modern English history, and the politics of the literary canon. Students will be invited to analyse early versions of Shakespeare's plays, source texts Shakespeare likely used when writing the play, the play's adaptation history and theatre productions and films based on */King Lear/*.
