#### Contenu

This seminar will explore the ideological assumptions of English royalism as we explore a range of poetic genres, from Cavalier poetry and panegyrics to mock heroics and ballads. The period covered, c. 1630-1688, spans some of the most turbulent crises in English history, thereby offering an opportunity to observe changes in the ways in which those loyal to the monarchy sought to express their allegiance in key works of literature.

#### Forme de l'évaluation

Evaluation interne – an essay of 3000 words on a topic to be defined in consultation with the course tutor. The deadline for submission is 21.07.23.

The form of evaluation will remain the same even if we need to switch to distance learning.

#### Modalités de rattrapage

Rattrapage – an essay of 3000 words on a new topic, to be defined in consultation with the course tutor, and to be submitted by the start of the semester following the course.

#### Documentation

We will consult the same course book as that used for Lecture Course 3: The Norton Anthology to Literature, Volumes B & C (16th and early 17th century and the Restoration and 18th century) ISBN 978-0-393-60303-3 & ISBN 978-0-393-60304-0. Other texts will be posted to Moodle.
