Contenu

Drawing on recent work in Masculinities studies, an interdisciplinary field of research concerned with the social construction of what it means to "be a man", this seminar will focus on a series of American novels published between 1949 and 1971 that not only fictionalize manhood, but have also acquired a "cult following" in one form or another, and have been or continue to be the object of censorhip. Corresponding with the Baby Boom and unbridled economic development, but also with two wars and various civil rights' movements, these novels often express the post-war generation's alienation, restlessness, and quest for experience, which led in several of these works to a counter-cultural embrace of drugs and sex. Looking back at this period through the prism of fourth-generation feminism, we will see how the male protagonists' performance of "manhood," often translating into a will to style, also concealed deep insecurities. An underlying question will be whether these novels still deserve to be read and taught.

Forme de l'évaluation

One in-class oral presentation (20%) and one essay (10-12 pages, 80%)
