Contenu

In the autumn of 2021, yet another film on King Arthur and his knights appeared: David Lowery's The Green Knight, starring Dev Patel as Sir Gawain. The fantastic Arthurian world easily lends itself to cinematic adaptations that capture the modern audience's imagination. Indeed, it is teeming with chivalric adventures, ill-advised love, burning jealousy, cunning magicians and wild creatures. In this seminar, we will read medieval texts (in Modern English translations) from which contemporary film-makers draw their inspiration. We will begin by focusing on the legendary king's different roles in the earliest and latest full-fledged account in Middle English, LaÈ#amon's late 12th-century Brut and Sir Thomas Malory's 15th-century Le Morte Darthur. We will then move on to the narrative spin-offs dedicated primarily to the Knights of the Round Table. In our discussion, we will also touch upon various features of medieval culture such as courtly love and chivalric ideals, religious beliefs and political ideologies as well as the possible functions of magic and the wilderness.
