#### Contenu

The aim of this Proseminar I is to familiarize MA students in philosophy with key concepts that are used across different subdisciplines of philosophy. Over the course of the semester, students will have the opportunity to interact with a variety of professors who will discuss central methodological questions and philosophical topics in their areas of expertise, including: begging the question; modality; parthood and composition; essence, dependence, and explanation; the mind/body problem; actions, acts, and activities; intentionality and intensionality; reasons; values; fiction; justification and responsibility; varieties of social phenomena; and time.

#### Forme de l'évaluation

The final grade will be based on a written exam (3 hours), no documents allowed. Regular attendance and participation in seminar meetings and in-class discussions is expected.
