#### Contenu

The "English Linguistics Workshop" is a mandatory, year-long course that aims to reinforce the material covered in the "Introduction to English Linguistics" lecture.

In line with the lecture, the workshop covers the following topics:

- FALL: Language and Linguistics, Morphology, Syntax, Semantics
- SPRING: Pragmatics, Historical Linguistics, Psycholinguistics, Sociolinguistics, Language Acquisition

During class, students will work on exercises to apply the knowledge gained from the lecture. To facilitate student learning, the instructor will review key concepts and, when appropriate, expand upon the material by introducing new related concepts or discussions.

#### Forme de l'évaluation

For each semester, there will be a few assignments (50%) and an in-class, final exam (50%).

The final grade will be the average of your grades for the fall semester and the spring semester. To pass the year, students will need to obtain a final average of 4.0 or above.

If the course had to be taught online due to sanitary measures, the in-class, final exam would be replaced by a take-home exam.

#### Modalités de ratrappage

A failing grade will result in a written retake ("ratrappage") at the end of the year. The retake covers material from the entire year.

#### Documentation

All materials (slides, exercises, readings, etc.) will be provided on Moodle.

#### Pré-requis

The course requires no prior knowledge of linguistics. English language skills are necessary.

This is an task-based workshop. The course relies on your active participation.
