Contenu

The course takes both a theoretical and practical approach to English language teaching and learning. Students will study established language learning theories as well as current issues in language learning and teaching research. The course will also have an applied aspect, in which students will learn how to create different learning tasks.

Forme de l'évaluation

There are four components being evaluated in this seminar.

1. Weekly online homework assignments (10% of the final grade) based on the weekly reading.
2. Weekly in-class participation (10% of the final grade).
2. A mid-semester in-class exam (30%).
3. An in-class, written, closed-book exam of 90 minutes at the end of the semester (50% of the final grade). In the case of a public health crisis, the exam will take place via Webex.

Modalités de rattrapage

Failure to reach 60% of all possible points will incur a rattrapage of a written assignment of about 10 pages (3,500–4,000 words) on an assigned topic, to be completed before the beginning of the new academic year.

Pré-requis

The class requires no prior knowledge of linguistics. English language skills are necessary.

Forme de l'enseignement

Weekly lecture with exercises and discussion in class based on at-home readings.

- Describe the basic principles of second-language learning

- Prepare level-appropriate exercises for students, with special emphasis on high-school level students
